## **FRENCH WHITE**

**THE LOIRE VALLEY**—based around the longest river in France, the Loire valley is an enchanting place that has been largely untouched by time—the wines are much the same as they were a century ago. With a focus on acidity these wines are meant for the table. The valley offers as diverse a selection as anywhere in the world and we have gathered a focused expression of the best each area has to offer.

*Sauvignon Blanc*—the grape thrives on the chalky mineral soils of the eastern Loire, and in certain places you find pockets of flint, locally called *silex*, that help lend the grape its most unique expression in the world.
